Summer Slide

During the summer, students can lose approximately 20% of their school-year gains in reading & 27% of their gains in math. Children who lack access to quality educational opportunities & learning activities during the summer are most susceptible to summer slide.

Lasting Impact

A child's summer learning experiences can impact his or her reading and math proficiencies in the long run & if he or she earns a high school diploma or enters college. According to the Johns Hopkins School of Education, "two-thirds of the ninth grade reading achievement gap can be explained by unequal access to summer learning opportunities during the elementary school years." For learners in low-income households, summer activities have an even greater influence.
