Supporting Vulnerable Minorities in China with Jason Jones

Saturday, July 29 at 2 p.m.

Forced labor and concentration camps are not a thing of the past. The United Nations, the New York Times, and the U.S. Department of Labor document that approximately one million Uyghurs and other mostly Muslim minorities are detained and subject to vicious maltreatment, including execution by forced organ donation, in the western region of China. ELANCO Library is honored to host Jason Jones, a human rights activist, award-winning (Bella, Crescendo), producer founder of The Vulnerable People **Project**, for a live online talk on this situation, and what U.S. citizens can do to help, followed by Q & A. All are welcome to gather in the library's upstairs Activity Room to view the talk together on our registration with large screen no required. LEGO Creation Club


Thursdays, June 29, July 13, & August 10 at 6 p.m.

Birding 101


Monday, July 3 at 6 p.m.
