

PREVENT SUMMER LEARNING LOSS

During the summer, students can lose approximately 27% of their school-year gains in math and 20% of their gains in reading. Children who participate in summer reading programs and in quality educational opportunities & *learning activities* during the summer are *least* susceptible to summer learning loss. The impact is lasting! According to the Johns Hopkins School of Education, "two thirds of the ninth grade reading achievement gap can be explained by unequal access to summer learning opportunities during the elementary school years." For learners in low-income households, summer activities have an even greater influence. Do your part to stop the summer slide! Enroll your children in our summer reading challenges and bring them to library programs! Support the library to enable others in our community to do the same!
