FROM THE DIRECTOR'S DESK

The Eastern Lancaster County Library, formerly known as New Holland Library, was established in 1933 by the New Holland Business and Professional Women's Club. The library houses over **40,000** items in its physical collection, including books, magazines, DVDs, audiobooks, music CDs, board games, museum passes, family STEM kits, and more. Patrons have access to a wealth of eBooks, eAudiobooks, research databases, online reference sources, and to services such as Chat with a Librarian and Interlibrary Loan through the library's membership in the Library System of Lancaster County. Serving approximately **25,000 residents** of five rural municipalities (Caernarvon Township, East Earl Township, Earl Township, New Holland Borough, and Terre Hill Borough), the library aspires to be **a community center aiding in the creation of a stronger and healthier community and civil society.**

In 2022, ELANCO Library focused on developing our **partnerships**, **programs**, and **community outreach**. Seeking creative ways to collaborate with local governments, business organizations, educational institutions, and community groups to position the library to be the ELANCO Community's all-inclusive resource for education, empowerment, enlightenment, enrichment, and entertainment, we participated in **45** outreach events in 2022. We worked with a variety of organizations and individuals to develop and host numerous cosponsored programs. As interest in attending in-person events increased, ELANCO Library offered **300** programs, with a special focus on **STEM programming for children**. (A shark dissection was one of our more unique offerings!) We are excited to have begun a lecture series for adults, featuring a variety of local experts, aimed to advance basic, information, civic & social, health, and financial literacies, in addition to our usual book & craft clubs. We offered at least two storytimes each week, in addition to other programs designed to promote language acquisition, **early literacy**, and **reading and school readiness** for young children.






Door Count














AGE OF PARTICIPANTS

We also added a new *Storytime Nook* to this room, a space shared with the New Holland Band Museum. Less visible, but no less important, *ELANCO Library's failing internet wiring was completely replaced*, and enhancements and improvements were made to the set-up and structure of the wiring and its to connections to computers and other equipment. These critical upgrades ensure that we will carry on functioning as a modern library for years to come.

BASIC LITERACY

"Developing foundational competency including reading, writing, math, job application assistance, and overall life-skill development. Also includes STEM (Science Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) knowledge building on basic skills and concepts."

"Each year, low literacy costs the U.S. \$225 billion or more in non-productivity in the workforce, with crime, and loss of tax revenue due to unemployment."

INFORMATION LITERACY

"Having the ability to express, connect with and understand knowledge and communication through comprehensive and innovative formats; the ability to distinguish between credible and non-credible sources; recognizing when information is needed to further oneself, an objective or a project."

"Studies indicate that the overall presence of library (information literacy) instruction is the determining factor between higher and lower grade point averages in college students."



CIVIC AND SOCIAL LITERACY

"Engaging in discourse while remaining respectful of other individuals of varying opinions; understanding the importance of community engagement which allows individuals to interact with one another, in a participatory manner; invoking societal change."

"Greater civic knowledge is the leading factor in promoting the kind of active civic engagement that has proven to be emblematic of effective citizenship."

HEALTH LITERACY

"Having the ability to make informed decisions in relation to an individual's physical, mental, emotional, or spiritual health; Also applies to caregivers understanding the health information of a loved one."



"In addition to the effects of low health literacy on the individual patient, there are also economic consequences. Your average mid-sized community hospital that sees 5,000 patients per year spends an additional \$1.8 million dollars covering the costs associated with health literacy."



FINANCIAL LITERACY


"Having the knowledge and understanding necessary to make informed fiscal/economic decisions for personal life planning and business interests including responsible budgeting, spending and saving skills."
