- Create your account using the steps above.
- Then go to the Google Play Store (on Android phones) or the Apple Store (on iPhones), search for *Transparent Language Online*, and *download the free app*.
- Log in using the username & password you created and commence exploring!

<u>Transparent Language Online</u> will save your place as you work through the progressive lessons and suggest activities, quizzes, and learning pathways tailored to your goals. In addition to courses for adults to learn 120+ languages, Transparent Language Online provides *KidSpeak* courses designed to help children learn many widely-spoken languages, as well as resources for those learning *English as a Second Language* and American Citizenship Courses.
