All are invited to join us on *Monday, April 8 from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m.* at ELANCO Library for a *Solar Eclipse Party*! We will have space- and solar-themed activities for all ages, snacks, and a livestream of the event from different locations. A limited quantity (70 pairs) of *solar viewing glasses* (ISO certified safe for direct solar viewing) will be available at the library for attendees of this program on a first-come, first-served basis. No registration is required.

On **August 21, 2017**, a **total eclipse of the Sun** was visible across the United States for the **first time in nearly a century**. **Libraries** conducted more than **35,000 science programs** before and during this breathtaking celestial event, reaching approximately **1,750,000 people**; they also enabled **6 million** people to observe the eclipse safely. The spectacular and stunning beauty of the totality is a vision many will remember their entire lives. It was likewise an unforgettable and magnificent experience to behold and be part of so many people of all ages, backgrounds, and viewpoints united in the joy and wonder of observing a phenomenon larger than ourselves.
