Every Child & ** Ready to Read & ** Music & Movement Mondays at 10:30 a.m.

Sing, dance, chant, listen to music, move, and play instruments, while exploring the patterns and sounds that make up our language. **Each month, we'll focus on a different theme:**

January: All About Instruments: Learn about the major instruments of the band and the orchestra through listening, play, and stories.

February: Musical Opposites: Explore concepts of loud/soft, fast/slow, high/low, short/long, and more, with songs, activities, and books.

March: American Treasures: Sing, listen, and read your way through the great musical traditions of the United States.

April: Music from Around the World: Learn about the opposites of night and day through stories, crafts, and activities! **May**: Silly at the Symphony: Join us for a hands-on, playful introduction to classical music.

This musical storytime is designed to promote language development and reading readiness skills while providing young children with joyful introductions to a variety of music and music-making experiences. Also a great storytime experience for active children who do not enjoy sitting still! For ages 0-6; siblings welcome.

Preschool Storytime Tuesdays at 10:30 a.m.

Preschoolers are invited to enjoy themed books, songs, rhymes, or movement activities while building language and literacy skills. For ages 4-6 and siblings.

Toddler Thursdays Thursdays at 10:30 a.m.

Toddlers will dance, zoom, scoot and hop between stories selected to promote language development. All adults are expected to participate and encourage the children to join in the fun. For ages 0-3 and siblings.

Each month, we'll focus on a different theme for Preschool Storytime and Toddler Thursdays:

January: Cats and Dogs: Woof! Meow! We'll read some of our favorite books featuring our furry friends!

February: *Emotions*: Join us for stories and activities featuring identifying feelings and managing emotions!

March: *Weather*: Look up in the sky, what do you see? We will focus on stories and activities that explore weather and the seasons!

April: Trees, Flowers, and Plants: Join us to learn and grow as we take a closer look at trees, flowers, and plants.

May: Dinosaurs: Join us as we roar, stomp, and learn together through stories featuring some of our favorite prehistoric creatures!




Winter Play & Learn Series




Lego Creation Club Thursdays, January 23, February 13, March 13, April 10, and May 8 at 6 p.m.
