July: Shapes: Join us to explore the shapes we see in the world around us. August: Transportation: Join us to investigate vehicles and other ways we navigate the world!




ELANCO Area Summer Play and Learn Series -Ready for Kindergarten!

Lafayette in Lancaster with Benton Webber

While but a teenager, the French aristocrat Marquis de Lafayette left his home in France and traveled to the newly formed United States of America to help it win the Revolutionary War. A half century later, in 1824 & 1825, he was invited to return as a celebrated guest of the nation and traveled across the United States for 13 months. Local historian **Benton Webber** will discuss Lafayette's 1825 visit to Lancaster as well as the special events planned to commemorate it during the 2025 Bicentennial Reenactment Tour.

Folded Book Art Class Monday, June 16 at 6:30 p.m.


