**ELANCO Library** and **Garden Spot Village** recently collaborated to set up a **StoryWalk** which spans the Library grounds and the Garden Spot Village campus! StoryWalks are designed to encourage two positive activities, reading a book and taking a walk; with a view to promoting literacy, parental involvement, physical movement/activity, and positive community relationships. People of all ages are encouraged to read a children's picture book while walking along a short path, sometimes with prompts to discuss a question or do an activity at each post. The first book in the StoryWalk is Goodbye Winter, Hello Spring by Kenard Pak. ELANCO Library will put a new book in the StoryWalk approximately every three months, and ELANCO Library and Garden Spot Village will periodically offer special StoryWalk events, both individually and jointly. *Everyone is* also invited to enjoy walking and reading your way through the StoryWalk on you own at any time!
