ELANCO LIBRARY 2024 COMMUNITY IMPACT REPORT



The Eastern Lancaster County Library (ELANCO Library) aspires to be a **community center**

aiding in the creation of a stronger and healthier community and civil society. As the public library for approximately **25,000** residents of five rural municipalities (Caernarvon Township, East Earl Township, Earl Township, New Holland Borough, and Terre Hill Borough) and beyond, we've served the public for **91** years since our establishment in **1933** by the New Holland Business and Professional Woman's Club.

In 2024, ELANCO Library made the bold move to expand and renovate our Children's Library, and the Library's entire Lower Level. This project was made possible due to a generous donation of \$150,000 from an individual who insisted upon remaining strictly anonymous and stipulated that the contribution could not be used for ordinary operating expenses but rather was for a special new project to "do something good for the library". Listening to library users, ELANCO area residents, and community leaders and organizations, we identified the most pressing need and desire that ELANCO Library could fill: a new high-quality learning and gathering space for families, especially for parents of preschool-aged children. ELANCO Library thanks the numerous individual and business donors who gave funds towards the renovation, the volunteers who contributed their expertise and labor, and the businesses who provided donated and discounted products and services. Weaver Commercial was wonderful to work with as they completed the construction, renovation, and finishing, and their final products are beautiful. A most special thank you is due to Jen Watson, ELANCO Library's Assistant Director/Youth Services Coordinator who displayed remarkable dedication, ingenuity, and skills beyond those normally required of a children's librarian during the execution of this project. Due to the hard work of ELANCO Library's extraordinary team, which includes nine Library Assistants and our Controller, ELANCO Library continued all services and children's programs as usual and made sure that approximately 64% of the library's children's books and other materials remained available for checkout during the renovation, although the Children's Library, and the Library's entire Lower Level, was closed from January to May 2024.

The vision of the ELANCO Library is to be a highly valued, **inclusive** community resource for education, empowerment, enlightenment, enrichment and entertainment. Approximately **40**% of children who live in the Library's service area do not attend public schools, but rather, are **homeschooled**, **attend small church-based schools**, **or participate in co-ops or other educational arrangements**. A focus for ELANCO Library in 2024 was to **increase the support the Library offers to these learners and their families**, while **maintaining our strong partnership with**, and **extensive provision of services to**, **ELANCO School District**. Initiatives included launching a **speaker series featuring guest experts** who provided their insights on navigating Pennsylvania's homeschooling laws, developing reading fluency, and charting the path from homeschooled high school to college, career, or military, and more; **beginning to select, create**, **and assemble new hands-on learning kits to support homeschooling families to add to the library's lending collection**; and providing additional library instruction, resource sessions, and alerts to homeschooling families and co-ops.

If 2024 was the year of enhancements to the library's Lower Level, in 2025, you can look out for exciting changes on the library's Top Floor. ELANCO Library plans to make urgently needed improvements to building infrastructure in 2025. Finally, 2025 will mark the conclusion of the library's 2023-2025 Strategic Plan. We will work with our community to craft a new five year plan to continue to offer cardholders and other library visitors free, convenient, and consistent access to the books and other information resources they need, and to intentionally and effectively provide quality programs and services to all residents of ELANCO Library's service area.

Thinking even farther ahead, to cope with the formidable challenge of having to raise 60% or more of our very frugal operating budget each year, we will be seeking creative solutions to obtain stable, sufficient, and sustainable funding for the library so that we make it to our 100th anniversary in 2033 and ensure that our vital offerings continue for many generations to come.




Door Count

ELANCO Library offered 299* programs in 2024!

*ELANCO Library's Children's Library, and the Library's entire Lower Level, closed for renovations on January 6, 2024 and re-opened on May 30,2024. During that time, approximately 30% of the Library's collection was UNAVAILABLE for browsing and checkout, and the library offered fewer programs than usual. Despite this, new library card registrations increased significantly, door count increased modestly, checkouts remained nearly identical, and program attendance decreased only modestly, from 2023 to 2024.

Can we calculate it? Well, we can multiply the number of checkouts for various types of items by the average retail cost of that item. By that math, we can determine that in 2024, ELANCO Library patrons got a physical item value of \$3,560,736! That's an average of \$536 per cardholder! But the community space; the programs; the expertise; the support; the online resources; the education, empowerment, enlightenment, enrichment, and entertainment from reading; and everything else that comes with your local library? Priceless.








ELANCO PARTICIPATION BY YEAR
